I am currently working toward my PhD in Visual art. The title of my dissertation is *The Ephemeral Nature of Things: Becoming (Com)posthuman in Climate Grief.* The work leading up to this journey have been an ongoing process of becoming with the planet, for reconnecting to our life sustaining habitat and reflecting this through my artistic practice. In 2023 I offered a very successful landscape Course in two parts over a year consisting of 30 weeks.

With the eye on encouraging similar ongoing exploration amongst the willing, I am planning a similar, though less demanding Landscape Course Online.

# Background:

I am a teaching artist, who completed my Master of Visual arts degree through Unisa in 2020, graduating *Cum Laude*. I am currently working towards my PhD in Art through Unisa. I also hold a NHD in jewellery design and have been teaching drawing, design and painting from my home-based studio in Boston, Bellville since 2009. My aim with the Visual Arts Course is to teach, mentor and inspire aspiring artists (from beginners to advanced) to grow in technique, as well as concept, all while doing so in a relaxed atmosphere. The ultimate goal is to teach without the student feeling pressured to perform, you will learn while having fun. The class group learn an equal amount from each other, and the environment provides a safe space to develop your skills.

# How the Course works:

Every year I offer a course comprising of 30 weeks – The Course will be split into two semester courses: The first (15 Weeks) focusing on drawing and composition in landscape art and the second on colour theory and painting techniques in landscape art.

Teaching takes place online, via You Tube and includes 4 online tutoring sessions / Semester on a Monday evening at 18h30 on Zoom.

The Semester / Year Course will consist of a theory lesson via Zoom, providing background to the theme, technique or concept being taught during the semester, the project will be discussed, some conceptual brainstorming will occur, where after each student will work on the project and schedule feedback sessions on Zoom during the semester.

## Terms and Conditions:

Once you have registered and paid your course fees / first instalment (for the Year /Semester) I will send the first of a series of Project briefs via WhatsApp and You Tube, hereafter mentoring will continue via Zoom/You Tube through demonstration videos for the duration of the Semester / Year.

Feedback sessions are scheduled during teaching weeks on Mondays **evenings 18h30 – 19h15 via Zoom.** 

## Notice Period

All Course fees are payable in advance.

Should you opt for the monthly payment plan you will remain liable for the full course fees as the course fee covers the program and the intellectual property that goes along with it and should therefore not be seen as attendance fees.

## Fees:

I believe in rewarding commitment, therefore students who commit to the full year course receive a reduced rate, as opposed to students who only enroll for a semester at a time.

Course Fee per Year: R 7 800 for 30 weeks / year

Payable in Twelve (12) instalments (January – December) R 650 / month

Course Fee per **Semester**: R **4 500** for **15 weeks / semester** 

Payable in Six (6) instalments **R750 / month** (January – June / July - December)

# Payment options:

Year Program: R 7 800 payable once-off.

Or R 650 payable in advance on the first day of the month for 12 months

Semester Program: R 4 500 payable once-off

Or R 760 payable in advance on the first day of the month for 6 consecutive months

Fees become payable once I have confirmed your registration in the course.

# Curriculum: microcosm

This year will focus on the technical principles of Drawing, Composition, Colour and Painting as they relate to landscapes:

#### Semester One: New Media & Drawing.

The first semester will concentrate on Drawing and Composition principles. Students will learn the basic design principles as they relate to creating a balanced and intriguing composition. The first 2 lessons will address photo editing software and techniques to manipulate photographs in order to create engaging compositions. Some colour theory principles will be applicable as drawing will be taught in charcoal / pastel, relating to using colour in order to generate interesting light. The objective will be for each student to produce at least one, ( no smaller than a half sheet 56cm x 76cm ) drawing, in a dry medium of their choice, over the 8-week course.

#### Semester Two: Colour Theory and Acrylic painting as underpainting.

The second semester will concentrate on Colour Theory and painting principles. Students will learn how to use complimentary and split complementary underpainting (in acrylic) to create vibrant grounds which will later be painted in oils. The format(s) will be painted first in acrylic using complimentary pure hues with spilt complementary tonal hues on the background. I usually teach the acrylic painting component during the first half of the course to allow work to dry faster during wet Capetonian winters. The oil painting techniques (glazing and wet into wet, as well as Ala Prima) will commence in the second half of the semester, starting September / October). The objective will be for each student to produce at least two large scale (60cm x 40cm maximum) portraits over the 16-week course.

Laurette de Jager Visual Art Courses does not offer any accreditation, the outcomes of the course are not evaluated. However, a high level of commitment and technical growth is expected. The objective of my art classes is to stimulate your own creativity, the main objective remains to create a relaxed creative atmosphere wherein artists can share their passion for the creative with likeminded individuals!
